DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Mike Warren, Police Chief reported to the board the statistics for calls for service, traffic stops, number of tickets written, and number of arrests for the period July 7, 2014 through July 27, 2014 as compared to the same period in 2013. The Chief then updated the board on the progress being made in the installation and training on the recently purchased records management software for the Police Department.

Barry Burnside, Fire Chief, reported the statistics on the number of service calls including medical and fire calls for the period of January 2014 to July 2014 as compared to the previous year. He also updated the board on the call history for the last four years.

Mike Parker, Director of the Public Works Department reported the number of work orders filed and completed and the number of new water customers for the month of July 2014. He informed the board that the intersection improvements to the College Street and Old Highway 80 intersection had been completed, that the Household Hazardous Waste Day was set for October 4, 2014 from 8:00 am to 12 noon at the Public Works Facility, the City Wide Cleanup event would begin October 4, 2014 and last for one week, also the Junior Civic League had provided the Public Works employees with lunch on August 1, 2014, and that he would be attending a FEMA/MEMA training session.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN DISCUSSION AND REPORTS

APPROVE AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CLINTON, MISSISSIPPI, AMENDING THE EXISTING ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CLINTON AS TO THE PROHIBITION OF UNNECESSARY NOISE BY ADDING AN ADDITIONAL SECTION TO SPECIFIC UNLAWFUL NOISES AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES

Upon presentation by Mike Cashion, Alderman Ward 6, MOTION made by Alderman Cashion and SECONDED by Alderwoman Cossitt the board approved an Ordinance of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, amending the existing ordinances of the City of Clinton as to the prohibition of unnecessary noise by adding an additional section to specific unlawful noises and for related purposes. During the discussion Alderman Cashion gave a history of the noise ordinance and the amendments. Alderman Cashion did state that the City had changed since the original ordinance had been passed and that this amendment would add to the quality of life and that it does not ask the police to enforce this amendment. Enforcement would be handled by the citizen. The citizen would have to sign an affidavit and go to court to have their grievance heard. Other comments by the other members of the board included concerns that this amendment was not needed and whether the police would have to enforce this amendment.
