MOTION made by Alderman Wilbanks and **SECONDED** by Alderwoman Oliver the board approved the Consent Agenda Items A – L with Item 6B removed. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA ITEM 6B

Upon <u>MOTION</u> made by Alderman Chapman and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alderman Lott the board approved Consent Agenda Item 6B. Alderman Wilbanks left the meeting at 6:02 pm and returned to the meeting at 6:03 pm. Alderman Wilbanks did not participate in the discussion of this item, nor did he vote on this item. <u>MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY</u>

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DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORT

Tara Lytal, Director of Main Street notified the board that Main Street hosted 59 events in 2022. She then reported that in the late fall of 2022 she hired a Depot Manager/Assistant Manager of Main Street. Tara also gave an update on the work of the Downtown Roadmap Committee and she announced some of the upcoming events for 2023. These events included Olde Towne after Dark, Art in the Parks, Dinner & a Movie and the Olde Towne Markets. Finally she announced that Red Brick Roads Festival would be held again this year and she gave an update on the new Christmas decorations that were placed around the City during the recent holiday season.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN DISCUSSION AND REPORTS

APPROVE AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE EXISTING ORDINANCE OF MAY 7, 2002, REGULATING THE SALE OF BEER AND LIGHT WINS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CLINTON TO ALLOW FOR THE SALE AND SERVICING OF BEER AND/OR LIGHT WINE TO CERTAIN BUSINESSES, AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES

Upon presentation by Alderman Lott, Alderman Ward 6, MOTION made by Alderman Lott and SECONDED by Alderwoman Oliver the board did not approve an Ordinance amending the existing Ordinance of May 7, 2002, regulating the sale of beer and light wine within the municipal limits of the City of Clinton to allow for the sale and servicing of beer and/or light wine to certain businesses, and for related purposes. THE MOTION TO APPROVE FAILED BY A VOTE OF 2 AYES AND 5 NAYS. ALDERWOMAN OLIVER AND ALDERMAN LOTT VOTED AYE TO APPROVE. ALDERWOMAN GARRETT, ALDERWOMAN GODFREY, ALDERMAN MARTIN, ALDERMAN CHAPMAN AND ALDERMAN WILBANKS VOTE NAY TO NOT APPROVE.

Upon presentation by Russell Wall, City Clerk, <u>MOTION</u> made by Alderman Wilbanks and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alderman Martin the board accepted the proposal submitted by BankPlus, to serve as Primary Depository for the City of Clinton for the next four (4) years, with the period ending December 31, 2026. <u>MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY</u>

APPROVAL TO PURCHASE 2 DODGE CHARGER POLICE VEHICLES FOR THE BEST QUOTE OF \$63,200.00 FROM LANDERS DODGE

Upon presentation by Ford Hayman, Police Chief, <u>MOTION</u> made by Alderwoman Godfrey and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alderwoman Oliver the board approved the purchase of 2 Dodge Charger police vehicles for the best quote of \$63,200.00 from Landers Dodge. <u>MOTION CARRIED</u> UNANIMOUSLY

Upon presentation by Courtney Nunn, Director of Parks and Recreation, <u>MOTION</u> made by Alderman Chapman and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alderwoman Garrett the board approved contingent on the results of the MEA drug Test the hiring of Kyeonia Harris as a Grounds Technician in the Parks and Recreation Department. <u>MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY</u>

Upon presentation by Phillip Lilley, Director of Public Works, <u>MOTION</u> made by Alderwoman Godfrey and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alderman Lott the board accepted the lowest and best quote from Bobcat of Jackson in the amount of \$74,903.24 for one (1) E50 R2-Series Bobcat Compact Excavator for the Clinton Public Works Department. <u>MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY</u>

Upon presentation by Greg Gearhart, Consulting City Engineer, <u>MOTION</u> made by Alderwoman Oliver and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alderwoman Godfrey the board approved and accepted the award to the lowest and best bidder Hemphill Construction Company, Inc. in the amount of \$4,972,358.00 the Lovett Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade project and the board furthermore authorized the Mayor to execute all documents associated with the project. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

ALLOW THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT AND A NOTICE TO PROCEED BETWEEN THE CITY OF CLINTON, MISSISSIPPI AND HEMPHILL CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC. RELATED TO THE LOVETT WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY UPGRADE PROJECT

Upon presentation by Greg Gearhart, Consulting City Engineer, <u>MOTION</u> made by Alderman Chapman and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alderwoman Garrett the board voted to allow the Mayor to execute a contract and a Notice to Proceed between the City of Clinton, Mississippi and Hemphill Construction Company, Inc. related to the Lovett Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade Project. <u>MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY</u>
