#### INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

#### HINDS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

#### **AND**

#### CITY OF CLINTON, MISSISSIPPI

In Re: Improvements to Kids Towne Park, City of Clinton (2024)

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and entered into on the dates shown at the end of this document by and between HINDS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI (the "County"), a body politic and political subdivision of the State of Mississippi and the CITY OF CLINTON, MISSISSIPPI (the "City"), a municipal corporation, pursuant to and in accordance with the Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1974, Section 17-13-1, et seq. of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), and other applicable law.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County and the City believe it to be in their best interest to make improvements to Kids Towne Park, to include shade structures and education signage, within the City for the benefit of the citizens of the City, which are also within the boundaries of the County.

IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual benefits described herein, the parties agree as follows:

#### I. PURPOSE AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. AGREEMENT. This Agreement is entered into pursuant to and in accordance with the authorization of the Act found at Section 17-13-1 *et seq.* of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, as it now appears or is hereafter amended, and all provisions set forth in the Act are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth in words and figures, it being the intent

of the parties to this Agreement that such authority as is granted by the Act shall be exercisable by the parties to enable them to accomplish the scope of work in Subsection B. Scope.

- **B. SCOPE.** The nature and scope of the project contemplated by this Agreement is the improvement of Kids Towne Park, to include shade structures and education signage, within the City and County.
- **C. AUTHORITY.** The specific authority under which the County and the City may exercise the powers necessary to fulfill the terms of this Agreement are found, respectively, in Article 6, Section 170, Mississippi Constitution of 1890 and Sections 19-3-40, 19-3-41, 21-17-5, and 21-37-3 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.
- **D. PUBLIC BENEFIT.** It is acknowledged that each of the parties has formally considered this matter and has determined that it is in the public interest that they participate and cooperate in this project, and that substantial benefits are anticipated to inure to citizens of the County and the City by virtue of completion of the project.
- E. PARTICIPATION AND FINANCING. The County will participate in this project by providing funding in an amount of \$40,000.00 from any legally appropriate source. The City will participate in this project by constructing and providing ongoing maintenance after the completion of this project for the improvements.
- F. SIGNAGE. The parties agree that either the County or the City, to the extent either contributes funding, may install signage at the location of the project recognizing it as the sponsor for the work performed under this Agreement. Location and specifications for the respective signage, if any, shall be left to the discretion of the County and the City.

#### II. AMENDMENTS OR TERMINATION

This Agreement may be amended or terminated only with the mutual consent of both parties and such action shall be taken by resolution in the same procedural manner as required in the instance of the adoption of this Agreement.

#### III. ADMINISTRATION

The Directors of Parks and Recreation for the County and the City shall be the project administrators and shall be responsible for ensuring that there is full compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

#### IV. <u>DURATION</u>

This Agreement shall be in full force and effect from the effective date as explained in Section V. Enforceability, below and shall continue in effect until such time as the parties acknowledge, through the project administrators described in Section III. Administration above, that the activities contemplated by this Agreement have been completed.

#### V. ENFORCEABILITY

- A. APPROVAL. The parties understand that, as a condition precedent to this Agreement being enforceable, this Agreement shall be submitted to the Attorney General of the State of Mississippi for approval and that this Agreement shall not be enforced unless:
  - 1. Approved by the Attorney General, or until,
- 2. Sixty (60) days has passed since its submission and the Attorney General has failed to disapprove same, in which event the Agreement shall be considered approved and enforceable.

The Office of the City Attorney for the City of Clinton is responsible for submitting the Agreement to the Attorney General.

B. FILING. Upon approval by the Attorney General, or the passage of sixty (60)

days after submission without disapproval, copies of this Agreement shall be filed with the Chancery Clerk of Hinds County and the Mississippi Secretary of State. In accordance with the terms of the Act, the Agreement will not be deemed in force until proof of filing of the Agreement has been received from the Chancery Clerk of Hinds County and the Mississippi Secretary of State. The Office of the City Attorney for the City of Clinton shall be responsible for filing the Agreement and for notifying the project administrators that the Agreement is properly in force. A copy of the Agreement will also be forwarded to the Clerk of the City for recordkeeping purposes.

C. PARTIAL ENFORCEABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement or any portion thereof is determined to be unenforceable or invalid by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, which determination is not appealed or appealable, for any reason whatsoever, such unenforceability or invalidity shall not invalidate the entire Agreement, but the Agreement shall be construed as if it did not contain the particular provision held to be invalid and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced accordingly.

#### D. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous arrangements or understandings with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.

There came on for consideration at a duly constituted meeting of the Mayor and Members of the Board of Alderman of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, held on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2024, the following Resolution:

### A RESOLUTION BY THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF CLINTON PROHIBITING THE USE, PURCHASE, POSSESSION, DISTRIBUTION, SALE OR OFFERING FOR SALE OF SYNTHETIC COCAINE, OTHER SYNTHETIC PRODUCTS, OR KRATOM

WHEREAS, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") has issued several warnings addressing illegal marketing of the drugs unproven ability to treat opioid withdrawal, heavy metals found in kratom products, and a recall on kratom products due to a risk of salmonella; and

WHEREAS, there are no FDA approved uses for the drug and in November 2017 the FDA issued a public safety advisory warning that kratom, which affects the same opioid brain receptors as morphine, appears to have properties that expose users to the risks of addiction, abuse and dependence; and

WHEREAS, kratom is not controlled under the Controlled Substances Act, and there are no state regulations or prohibitions against the possession and use of kratom. The FDA has not approved kratom for any medical use. In addition, the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration has listed kratom as a Drug and Chemical of Concern; and

WHEREAS, according to the Mayo Clinic, (1) studies on the effects of kratom have identified many safety concerns and no clear benefits; (2) kratom has been reported to cause abnormal brain function when taken with prescription medicines, causing severe headaches, the inability to communicate, or confusion; (3) in a study testing kratom as a treatment for symptoms of opioid withdrawal, people who took kratom for more than six months reported withdrawal symptoms similar to those that occur after opioid use. Also, people who use kratom may begin craving it and require treatments given for opioid addiction, such as naloxone(Narcan) and buprenorphine (Buprenex); (4) Kratom adversely affects infant development. When kratom is used during pregnancy, the baby may be born with symptoms of withdrawal that require treatment; and (5) as of April 2018, more than 130 people in 38 states became ill with Salmonella after taking kratom. Salmonella poisoning may be fatal and as of then, the FDA had linked more than 35 deaths to salmonella-tainted kratom. Salmonella contamination has no obvious signs, so the best way to avoid becoming ill is to avoid products that may contain it.

**BE IT ORDAINED** that the City of Clinton. Mississippi hereby adopts the following ordinance which prohibits the use, purchase, possession, distribution, sale or offering for sale of synthetic cocaine, other synthetic products or kratom, as set forth here in below to-wit:

**Section 1.** Use, purchase, possession distribution sale or offering for sale of synthetic cocaine other synthetic products or kratom; is prohibited.

- (a) No person shall use possess, purchase, distribute manufacture sell or attempt to use, possess, purchase distribute or sale or publicly display for sale any one or more of the following within the city:
- (1) Products sold as 'bath salts' under the trade names: Ivory wave, bliss, white lightning, hurricane Charlie, super code, cloud 9 peeve ocean magic white dove, and other trade names and/or containing one or more of the following compounds or chemicals:
- a. u3,4-Mehtylene-dioxymethcathinone (Methylone)
- b. u3,4-Methyenedioxy-pyrovalerone (MDPV)
- c. u4-Methylmeth-cathinone (Mephedrone)
- d. u4-Methoxymeth-cathinone
- e. u4-F1uorometh-cathinone
- (2) Products sold as "kratom" or any part of the plant Mitragyna Speciosa, Mitragyna Speciosa Korth, Mitragyna speciosa leaf extract Mitragyna speciosa extract, whether growing or not, and any compound, manufacture, salt derivative, capsule, tablet, caplet, gelcap, pill, powder, liquid, vegetative material, mixture, or preparation of the plant including but not limited to any product containing mitragynine, or 7-hydroxymitragynine.
- (3) This includes any Mitragyna speciose specific alkaloids, isomers, esters ethers salts and salts of isomers and ethers including but not limited to synthetics or natural products which include the active ingredients in kratom, such as:
- a. Ajmalicine (raubasine)
- b. Mitraphylline
- c. Rhynchophylli ne
- d. Mitragynine pseudoindoxyl

Section 2. That this Resolution shall take full force and effect immediately upon its passage and enactment according to law and shall be spread upon the minutes of the City.
